

Lance Morrison – Sharon Morrison Memorial Indigenous Education Fund

"When we moved to Yellowknife in 1981, we moved here with no family, no support, and little money. My parents were both high school dropouts and not a lot of opportunities were available. In 1985, my mom decided to make changes. Aurora College was launching a Homecare/Long-Term Care program, and Mom saw her chance to break the cycle of poverty we had always known. In her later years, she was passionate about learning nêhiyawêwin, our ancestral language. Mom's traditional name was Red Butterfly Woman and when we look at the lifecycle of a butterfly – from caterpillar to cocoon to butterfly – it represents a life of amazing transformation. Therefore, I wanted to ensure these bursaries and grants would also be transformational to their recipients. Mom would be glad her legacy can live on in these recipients for years to come."

"Helen and John Parker focused so much of their lives on helping and supporting others, not for personal accolades but in the spirit of making the community stronger. Their hearts will always be in Yellowknife, as they both wished to see the community grow and prosper into the future.
